





THANKS TO YOUR MUNICIPAL SUPPORT, VMSC...

Improved the lives of our staff by:

- Increasing the number of paramedics by 50%
- Introducing a 401(k) match
- Reducing health insurance out-of-pocket costs by 73.33%
- · Providing a 4% merit-based raise

Improved the lives of our communities by:

- Investing \$170,000 in new education efforts
- Graduating 10 paramedics from our first in-house paramedic program
- Building our simulation ambulance in our training center
- Adding clinical enhancements, including ultrasound, new advanced medications, emergency Z-Vent ventilators, and Sapphire pumps
- Developing our pre-hospital blood program, which will soon be introduced to our communities
- Expanding training by our medical direction team

And, Improved our equipment by:

- Adding PowerLoad systems to all ambulances, reducing the risk of injuries to our providers and patients
- Introducing a specialty ALS response vehicle, staffed by an advanced practice paramedic, to the North Penn and Indian Valley areas


Survivability of a Cardiac Arrest by VMSC 44.4% (an increase of 6% over 2023 due to improved training and equipment funded by Municipal Support)

Pennsylvania Average of 31.1% and Nationwide Average of 32.8%


